# Current Status

---

- A severe problem with budgeting due to more than **50% budget cut** this year from BSMI.
- The BSMI Project Budget Evaluation Board suggested we **cancel the contest of 2011 eASIA Award**, only concentrate on AFACT meetings held in both Kaohsiung in May and Taipei in November including EDICOM as shown on the 2011 AFACT Website.





# Reactions

---

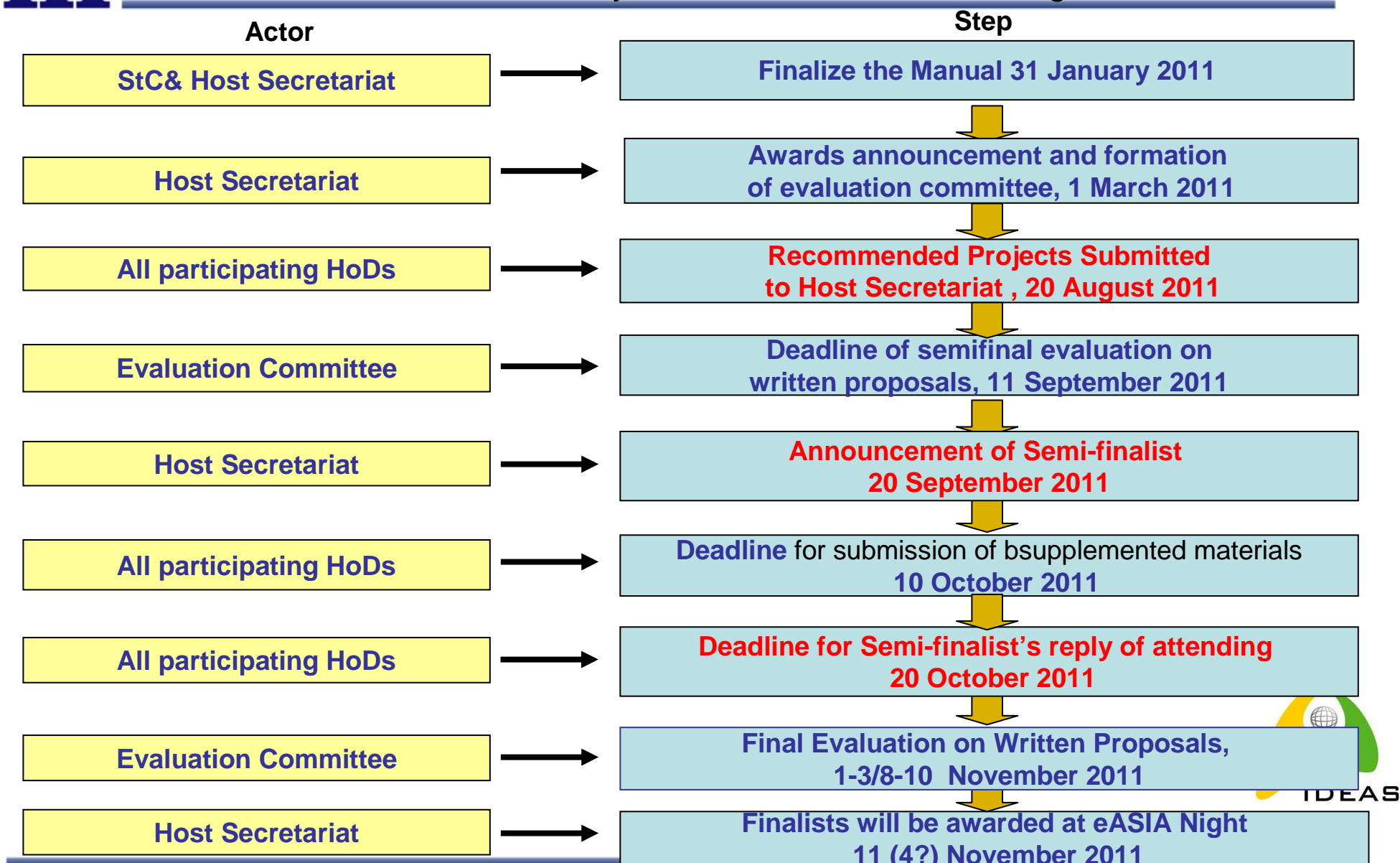
- Squeezed a little budget to finance traveling expenses of only **4 awardees** from two other projects which require speeches in EDICOM and an international conference with respect to Single Window, trade facilitation, and/or eGovernment.
- Reduce the scale of eAISA Award to only **process written proposal evaluation**. There is no oral presentation on the final evaluation.
- Rank the top 3 projects in each category, and **invite only the top one to CT** to present in the EDICOM and another conference. Other 2 Awardees of each category will be recognized by conferring plaques which will be brought back by respective HoDs.

- **Evaluation board:** only StC members, not include outside experts
- **Nomination for the Honorary Award**





# Conclusions

---

- **2011 eASIA Award?:** Yes
- **Award scale:** all members compete for only one type of Award
- **Evaluation scheme:** evaluate only on written proposals, rank 3 top projects in each category; but invite all 4 semi-finalists to CT for exhibition. Only the top one gives presentation in the EDICOM. The 4 semi-finalists will be financially supported with local accommodation, food, and transportation.
- **Evaluation board:** only StC members, not include outside experts
- **Nomination for the Honorary Award:** Nominated by StC members and select one in consensus by the Evaluation Board. Nomination should be submitted by 31 August.







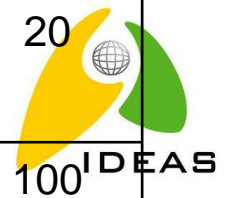

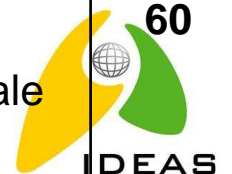

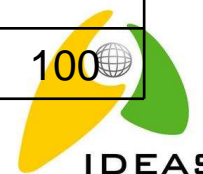
