I Introduction

This project should make the DTI (Destination Travel Information) available for use to world tourists to let them enjoy the points of interest in regions.

You may specify your point of interest, and then you may know how to reach there by being shown the course or trajectory you took. You may learn what the point of interest is.

The project was first proposed to UN/CEFACT Forum in September 2012 by South Korea through T/T Domain, and formally approved by the Bureau in October 2013 with the support of the countries, India and Japan. The development process of the project passed through the public review stage of its BRS (Business Requirements Specification) document in November 2014 with some amendments corrected accordingly. There remains the creation of RSM (Requirements Specification Mapping) document with their CCs and BIEs harmonized and codes created.

II Applications

The standards developed by the project could be accommodated with those developed by SLH Information Process Project to show, for example, how to reach one's specific SLH.

III Benefits

DTI standards could help world tourists search mainly their points of interest and reach there easily.

This project seems to be rather out of date now but could be a building block toward showing wider area for world visitors to a region with some specific purpose or purposes to visit. This will be checked by working further whether it would be worthwhile to keep working or not.
